Two hundred and fifty young virtuosos applied for this prestigious competition from around the world; thirty were chosen to compete for two days of semi-finals: six will compete for the finals prizes during a two-hour program at the Terrace Theater in Washington, DC.

Internationally renowned concert soloists, violinist Renee Jolles, violist Stephen Wyrczynski, and cellist Hans Jorgen-Jensen, will judge the finals competition, distributing \$33,000 in prizes. A first prize winner for each instrument will be awarded, as well as combined second and third prizes. The audience will also award \$1,000 to their chosen winner.
