Past winners of the Johansen International Competition have gone on to win the Naumburg, Tchaikovsky, Casals, Tertis, Cassado, Joachim, Queen Elisabeth, and many other competitions, and have been selected for such awards as the Avery Fisher Grant, Young Concert Artists, and Jack Kent Cooke scholarships. Former JIC winners sit in principal chairs of the Toronto Symphony, Los Angeles Philharmonic, New York Philharmonic, and St. Paul Chamber Orchestra and perform in solo and chamber music concerts worldwide.
